

Education Opportunities for Inmates at the Apache County Sheriff's Office Adult Detention Facility

The Apache County Sheriff's Office (ACSO) Adult Jail through an intergovernmental agreement with the Apache County Superintendent of Schools Office provides special education and related services for adult inmates who qualify, and who wish to work toward their high school diploma or GED. After eligibility is determined, an IEP (Individual Education Plan) is developed and then implemented. The IEP spotlights the academic, post-secondary, and transition needs of the student, while emphasizing re-integration into the community.

In addition to Special Education Services, the Apache County Jail provides GED Preparation Classes and Re-entry Services.

Re-entry Support Services link transitioning inmates to job services, continuing education, military, and other community service options; and Functional Vocational Assessments are used to help inmates establish their education, job and career goals, and to facilitate a successful transition to their families and community.
